

Occupational Demographics: Interstate Variation from the 2000 Census

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This study has been undertaken to assess the validity of using estimates of state occupational replacement rates based upon national data. The validity of using national data in lieu of specific state data rests upon the degree of interstate variation in the age distribution of occupational employment around the national “average.” Specifically, we address the issue of the magnitude of variation among the states in the portion of workers in each occupation who are age 55 or more, since the large majority of separations are in the highest age categories. The analysis is conducted using data from the 2000 decennial Census.

The results of the analysis have implications for how states should estimate occupation-specific replacement rates within the context of their development of occupational employment projections and estimates of new job openings. A similar study by Less and Ziss (1995) using 1990 Census data concluded that it was reasonable for states to use estimates based upon national data for the large majority of state occupations. With more recent data now available from the 2000 decennial Census, it is timely to see whether changes in occupational demographics from 1990 to 2000 make the use of national data in lieu of state-specific data still warranted. In addition we identify cases of state occupations that deviate significantly from their respective national average so that individual states may decide to use alternative estimates in these cases. These are shown in the Appendix Table organized by state FIPS code.

Description of Method

Using a file of cross-tabulated Census occupation x age category (5 year) for each state, we have calculated the percent of workers age 55 and over for the U.S. and each state plus the District of Columbia, for each Census occupation. Next, we calculate the standard deviation of the percentage of workers age 55 and over among the 51 states from the national percentage. From these results we estimate the 95 percent confidence interval for each occupation, and identify and “flag” those state occupation cells that fall outside the respective 95 percent confidence intervals. These cells are analyzed in terms of their respective employment levels, occupational categories, and states to reveal any consistent patterns. We also indicate the magnitude of the coefficient of variation among all Census occupations to indicate which occupations have the greatest interstate variation in age distribution. We compare the results to those obtained by Less and Ziss using the earlier 1990 Census data.

Results

1. Are Smaller State Occupations More likely to be Outliers?

There were 1,317 state occupation cells, out of a total of 24,440 that fell outside the respective 95 percent confidence intervals. The size distribution of these “flagged” cells, in comparison to the size distribution for all state occupation cells is shown in Table 1. The

flagged occupations clearly are concentrated in the small employment cells; over 60 percent have 500 or fewer workers (the Chi-Square statistic of 599.2 indicates significance at 0.001). These results are quite similar to the size distribution of flagged cells from the 1990 Census data (Table 2) calculated by Less and Ziss (1995), indicating temporal consistency.

2. Which Occupations Exhibit the Greatest Variation Among States?

The coefficient of variation (CV) was calculated for each Census occupation category. The CV is the standard deviation divided by the respective mean, which in this case is the national percentage of workers aged 55 or over. Thus the CV measures the degree of interstate variation in age distribution standardizing for magnitude of the mean. Occupations with high CVs are those in which the national estimates of replacement rates are relatively less accurate. Those occupations with CVs higher than 1.0 are shown in Table 3.

3. How Are the Outliers Distributed by State?

The distribution of flagged state occupational cells, by state, are shown in Table 4. By and large, the smaller the state, the larger the number of flagged cells. Eight states

account for one-half of the total number of flagged cells. These eight states are all small in terms of total statewide employment in 2000. On the other hand, 20 states each have fewer than ten flagged cells, and the 30 states with the smallest number of flags accounted for only 19.0 percent of significant deviations.

The results, again, are remarkably consistent with those obtained by Less and Ziss (1995). While our analysis does not answer the question of causality: whether significant deviations from the national age distribution are due to the statistical instability of state occupations with low levels of employment, or whether smaller states tend to have unusual age distributions for other reasons related to size, it is clear that there is a strong negative relationship between size of state occupation and deviation from the national age distribution.

Conclusions

The results of our analysis continue to support the validity of states continuing to use national estimates of occupational replacement rates, in the large majority of cases. Twenty two states have fewer than ten outliers, and all but nine have fewer than 50 detailed Census occupations that are outliers. The nine states with 50 or more outliers are nine out of the ten smallest states in population. The state occupations whose percent age 55 or older are significantly different than the national average for the respective detailed occupation tend to be small in size. The occupations which have the greatest interstate variation from the national average tend to be those which are highly unevenly distributed among the states, such that many states have zero or very small employment in those occupations, while the bulk of employment is concentrated in a relatively small number of states.

Analysts should consider adjusting the national replacement rates for the relatively small number of occupations that are listed as outliers in the Appendix Table A, based upon more detailed analysis of state occupational data.
